17/00643/FUL 20 Wymers Wood Road, Burnham, Church & Beeches
Two storey side and single storey rear extension.
The Committee **RESOLVED** to state that they had **NO OBJECTIONS**.

17/00602/FUL Land Rear of 73 High Street, Burnham, Church & Beeches
Apartment building comprising 6 dwellings with associated works.
The Committee **RESOLVED** to **OBJECT** to the application, as the intended work was largely seen as superfluous, especially within the conservation area. Furthermore, the Committee highlighted their concerns regarding the potential rise in the volume of traffic on to the narrow and busy highway as well. The intended area was noted as already rather congested and the addition of six dwellings was felt to be further intensification within the locality. It was also believed that there would be insufficient parking spaces, when considering visitors as well as the number of potential residents. Additionally, the Committee stated that the design of the proposal would have an adverse effect on the character of the area; many of the neighbouring buildings were historical and as a result listed, whereas this proposal was viewed to be more of a modern design, therefore incongruous with the identity of the street.


The Committee noted planning decisions made by South Bucks District Council.

The Deputy Parish Clerk informed the Committee that he was awaiting a response from the District Council on the matter along with several others, and would provide an update once he had received a reply.

Cllr. Pauline Poole queried whether the Deputy Parish Clerk or the Committee were aware of the circumstances surrounding 18-20 Eastfield Road, Burnham. She stated that metal gates had been installed on either side of the building, the shutters had been down for several months, and residents believed that the inside had been boarded up as well. Additionally, that a large amount of material had been cleared from the rear of the site. The Deputy Parish Clerk stated that he would investigate whether any unauthorised building work was taking place, or had taken place at the site.
