

Current Situation

Approximately 30% of children go to a grammar school in Buckinghamshire

So, where do the other 70% of our local pupils go to secondary school? They have to travel out of Burnham, mostly to Maidenhead.


See map of secondary schools in South Buckinghamshire on next slide:



Maidenhead and Slough are well served for non-selective secondary schools

Children who pass the 11+ can go to school locally at Burnham Grammar.

Children who do not pass the 11+ must travel out of Burnham. What catchment schools are offered to these children?

Pioneer Secondary Academy (Previously Khalsa)

This means that if your child does not pass the 11+:

- Longer school day
- Reduced access to after-school activities no late buses
- Discriminates against children who do not pass the 11+

If your catchment school is not suitable for your child, your only choice is to go out of county This costs approx. £1100 per child per year to Maidenhead in coach fares (from September 2022)

Year 6 students on roll at local primary schools, January 2022

70% (230) of these students will need a non-selective secondary school

230 students is well over the normal number of 180 for a new school

The Response From Buckinghamshire Council

"There is a decline in student numbers"

In fact, the Health Centre shows an increase in the number of children No consideration of impact of Elizabeth Line

"Parents choose to send their children to school in Maidenhead" Parents send their children to school in Maidenhead because there is no good, local school

"There are two non-selective secondary schools within five miles of Burnham"

Most parents consider these schools unsuitable. One is run by E-ACT, which failed at Burnham Park Academy. The other is a faith school.

The Response From Buckinghamshire Council

"Maidenhead can accommodate Burnham pupils for the foreseeable future"

- This is not guaranteed. Maidenhead has an extensive building programme.
- Burnham children are out of county and out of catchment.
- Similarly, houses are being built in Burnham which means even more children here.

"There are not enough pupil numbers in Burnham to justify a new school" Yes there are. The usual number of children enrolled for a new school is 180 and we have proved that there are 230.

Where ARE Schools Being Opened?

Kingsbrook School opens September 2022

- A new non-selective secondary free school in Aylesbury
- Initially open to 180, Year 7s only.
- Most students will live within 0.9 miles of the school.
- 2020 Population of the area: 4053
- 2020 Population of Burnham: over 12,000 (source – Buckinghamshire Council)

Despite all our numbers, we are denied a school! BURNHAM SECONDARY SCHOOL FOR ALL
